



GRANTS BY IMPACT AREA





PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL ADVISORS

In 2020, the inaugural cohort of the Network of Philanthropic Advisors completed a brand-new, professional development series focusing on strengthening client relationships through conversations about philanthropic giving.

More than a dozen professional advisors, including attorneys, accountants, financial advisors, and wealth managers gained perspective on what drives donors to give charitably.

“Judging from the feedback we’ve received, many of our participants have already started putting the skills from the workshops into practice,” says Alene G. Sussman, Director of Jewish Community Foundation. “The good news for professional advisors is that when **clients feel their entire plan, including philanthropy, is being addressed, they’re more likely to stay with their advisor.**”
