If I already make a gift of over \$1,800, am I part of BGS?

Yes, as long as you are in your 30s and 40s. For example, if you already made your donation to be a part of our Israel Emergency Campaign, then you are automatically part of BGS for this year.

Can I make my donation in the middle of the year?

Yes, you can make your gift at any point in our campaign year and still be a BGS donor for the entirety of the campaign year.

Do I have to pay the full donation all at once?
